

Annual Report The Rev. Dr. Martha Murchison Pastor, Sunrise Presbyterian Church January 25, 2015

Wow! 2014 was quite a year at Sunrise Presbyterian! We celebrated our 60th Anniversary in June with memories, pictures and a wonderful hymn sing. Our anniversary was the perfect time to dedicate our new Presbyterian hymnal, Glory to God. Members gave hymnals in memory and honor of loved ones so that Sunrise could sing a new song to the Lord! 2014 marked the first time we hosted Heartland Traveling Day Camp. Scott Lee and the Christian Education Committee made a bold leap in sponsoring the camp. Forty kids from Sunrise, area Presbyterian Churches, area churches and the neighborhood had a great week in June learning, playing, getting wet in the giant slip and slide and riding horses. It was a great success! Our Mariner's celebrated in August. Sunrise was busy with worship, singing, caring, and mission. This year we cared for one another and the world around us. The reports in this volume fill out the story of how we served God in 2014. Read through them to learn the details of our the story. Love is in the details of this report – members of Sunrise love and care for one another well. I am honored to serve as your pastor.

In 2014, I preached 44 sermons on Sundays, led Lenten, Holy Week and Christmas Eve Services and led 6 Sunday afternoon services at Presbyterian Manor. At Presbyterian Manor, we serve communion to all present during the afternoon worship service. In addition, I took communion approximately once a month to those at home who have requested it.

I really enjoy teaching. Each Tuesday at noon a group studies the weekly lectionary texts. I've been challenged each month as I help prepare those who teach Circle Bible lessons from II Corinthians. Following Scott Lee's resignation this fall, I began teaching Senior High Sunday School. We've been studying the overarching story of the Bible. I've also had quite a bit of fun leading the Youth Group each Wednesday. We have about 15 youth each week who love to play, eat, share, watch videos, and talk about their lives. Sunrise is blessed to have such a strong group.

With the Session, I have worked to ensure that Sunrise lives out the fullness of the Six Great Ends of the Church: the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind; the shelter, nurture, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God; the maintenance of divine worship, the preservation of the truth; the promotion of social righteousness; and the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world. Our committees do a good job of helping Sunrise fulfill these ends. I have attended most committee meetings. At each Session meeting, we take time to discuss the life and ministry of Sunrise so that together we may help Sunrise live into its mission. We've had many discussions as to how we can express joy and positive feelings in our lives and in the life of Sunrise.

I have visited those in the hospital, those at home and all others who have requested it. I have shared meals with many of you and have enjoyed your warm hospitality. I had fun at the God's Kids fishing trip and the Mariner's picnics. I was thrilled to welcome many of you to my home at an open house during the Christmas season. In 2014, I served on the Presbytery of Northern Kansas' Committee on Ministry. As a presbyter, I continue to serve on the Permanent Judicial Commission. I attended most meetings of the presbytery.

Study and Continuing Education are important to me. I read often and long. I read theology, Biblical criticism, books about ministry, the environment and culture. I read two or three newspapers daily. I often find that novels speak to the truth of the gospel. In January, I attended the PCUSA Hymnal Festival at First Presbyterian Church, Ft. Worth. The Festival proved a marvelous opportunity to learn more about the new hymnal. It was most helpful in our decision to purchase the book. In April, I attended the Festival of Preaching Northwest. The Preaching Festival offered me the chance to hear speakers and preachers from the Emerging Church movement. I gleaned much new information from that conference. (And had the opportunity to meet my new granddaughter!) In July, I spent two weeks at Ghost Ranch. My time at Ghost Ranch is always a Sabbath for me. I rise every day early for Morning Prayer with Phillip Newell. I work hard, play hard and enjoy God's amazing creation each day. I never fail to learn more about God, myself and the world. This year I helped to finish the Peace Garden we began last year. I always find that Ghost Ranch energizes and sustains me for the work of ministry. In October, PNK sponsored a retreat with cultural historian Diana Butler Bass. I found her presentations fascinating. For two days we discussed the changes in our culture and philosophy which have resulted in a growing group of people who are "spiritual but not religious." It was an important and helpful time.

I enjoy living in Salina and seek to help this community be as vital as it can. I serve on the Advisory Board at Presbyterian Manor and on the Advisory Council for the Volunteer Connection. I'm on the Fine Arts Demonstration Committee for the River Festival. I volunteer to help make the River Festival a success. Each year I help put together the dragon bridge. My love of arts led me to join the Steifel Theater Board. I'm a member of the Resilience Group at the Land Institute. I'm often seen around town promoting ways we can be more environmentally aware. I'm also often seen in my garden enjoying God's great bounty! In addition, I enjoy smocking and stitching for my granddaughter.

What an honor and a joy it is to be your pastor. Every day offers new grace and opportunity to share in God's Kingdom. Every day offers the time to listen for God. Every day offers us the chance to be the people who are the church. I look forward with great excitement to our life together in 2015 as we seek to be faithful to God who calls us.

The Nurture/Evangelism Committee is responsible for Sunrise membership and fellowship health, and activities that promote this. This includes new (and existing) members' welcome and support, monitoring attendance records, overseeing Sunday coffee hour donuts, the Wednesday night Sunrise Deli, providing *Pathway Thru Grief* booklets for those members who have lost loved ones, organizing Dinners for Eight annually, and coordinating a 4th Sunday of the month Dinner periodically.

While net results for 2014 were better than 2012, we did finish 2014 with a deficit of \$5,184. Thanks to the stronger finish in 2013 and the fact that we held expenses below the 2012 level, we have a sufficient carryover of \$8,177 to start 2015.

The 2015 Pledge drive was successful in bringing in pledges of \$202,000 in contrast to the 2014 amount of \$211,000. The 2015 budget is presented as a balanced budget, relying upon the use of the 2013-14 carry over.

The Dillon's Card 5 % rebate program resulted in \$5,442 income to Sunrise. This program is uncertain for 2015 due to Dillon's changes. We have estimated \$5,000 for the 2015 budget.

During the year the Stewardship and Finance Committee met 10 times. We monitored the expenses and income every month.

Considerable time has been spent with the off – budget designated funds. For 2015 we plan to continue to work more closely with the Memorial and Mission committees to see that those funds are used promptly and appropriately and that they are managed as simply as possible to keep the accounting concise and clear.

Sunrise has \$ 295,574.44 in endowment funds with the Greater Salina Community Foundation. We have additional Endowment Funds and Reserve funds in Bennington State Bank of Salina. These include: Building Endowment \$3385.55, General Endowment \$8,241, \$15,000 Castle Reserve and \$32,471 Building Reserve.

The old Church Development Corporation CD in the amount of \$3,543 has been merged with Bennington State Bank funds, but is shown in the accounting separately as a scholarship endowment. For 2015 we have again agreed to participate in Match Madness to advance our endowment. The Match funds received will go directly into the current operating fund budget.

The committee discussed two matters from Building and Grounds. First there is a bid to replace the MPR roof for \$24,800. The committee requested that a 2nd bid be obtained for the project and that it be paid from the Building Reserves Fund. Secondly, the Committee discussed the proposal for new carpet which originated in the Memorial Committee and was taken to Building and Grounds. Stewardship recommends that as much of the total cost of the project as can be come from Memorial Funds and that we raise the remainder. A second bid on the carpet is also requested.

We thank you for your generosity as shown by the sharing of your talents and of your finances. It is through your faithful and generous giving that sunrise continues to flourish.
