




Martha's Musings...

It seems like yesterday that I was at Austin Seminary paging through the *new hymnal*. We had early trial copies and used them to plan our daily chapel worship. It was exciting. There were new hymns and songs such as *Spirit* and *Here I Am, Lord*. We learned *Lift High the Cross* and *Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore*. I grew up with the old red hymnal. It looked old and the hymns were mostly older. It was wonderful to allow the new hymnal to shape my worship and praise. BUT that was 25 years ago! Even though I still call the blue hymnal the *new hymnal*, it is not anywhere near new. In fact, it's a generation old!

Every generation the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. publishes a new hymnal. The hymnal says a great deal about us. It identifies us and helps us call out our vision. The blue hymnal helped lead us towards a more full observation of the liturgical year. It introduced us to hymns from other countries, and it helped us learn contemporary hymns. *Glory to God*, the Presbyterian hymnal (we're getting red) also identifies us, and it is my prayer that it also will help us call out our vision.

Glory to God is a diverse hymnal because the PCU-SA is a diverse church! Presbyterians we see at Presbytery meetings look pretty much like us – and so we often fail to realize our diversity as a church. We are ethnically diverse: hymns are not only in English, but also in Korean and Spanish. Presbyterians are young, old and middle aged: hymns from the old red hymnal have returned and new praise choruses aimed at younger people are included. We like diverse styles of music. There are many wonderful chants from Taize in France. We've already enjoyed some of the gospel music in



the book. World music plays a large part in this hymnal as well as contemporary choruses and songs. Hymns we know and love are in the book and there are hymns that have recently been written. *Glory to God* is full of wonderful music to help us praise God.

In addition, *Glory to God* will help us make efficient use of staff time. Many of the praise choruses we sing each week will now be in hymnal. There will be no need to type the lyrics. It will be so much easier for Angie to create the Powerpoint and bulletin each week. Sunrise has already purchased the on-line version of the hymnal. I've especially enjoyed being able to listen to an audio clip of hymns I'm thinking of using. I also find it meaningful that the history of each hymn is included.

For centuries, the church has been guided by the words, *lex orandi*, *lex credendi* – *as we pray so we believe*. We often forget that our hymns and songs are sung prayer. The words we sing shape our belief as much or more than any sermons or scripture. How wonderful it is that we can usher in a new hymnal to help us better connect to the great diversity of the church as we praise God.

I'm excited that Session has approved the purchase of *Glory to God.* May it help us be better able to worship *lost in wonder, glory and praise!*

CHURCH TAXI SERVICE

Need Transportation to Church or to a Church Event?

Sunflower Cab has agreed to help us with the transportation to assist members and guests to and from our services. This service is for those unable to drive, or with an injury or illness. The charges are \$1.50 per mile, with a minimum of \$5.50 per trip. However, with the vouchers, completely filled out, you will not have to pay anything for your ride to Church. The vouchers will take care of the charges. It does not matter if there are one or more persons at one stop. However, if there is more than one person at the stop, all names should be on one voucher. They will assist someone using a wheelchair, a cane, and so on, but cannot lift anyone in or out of the cab.

You (the rider) will need to call Sunflower Cab at 826-1881 and schedule a pick up. Be sure to call at least one (1) hour ahead. You can also pre-schedule a ride, however it is important to call and cancel if you cannot come. Otherwise we will be charged even if you do not ride. Complete the "Transportation Voucher" and give it to the driver and sign the voucher they will have for you. It's that easy. If you have any questions, please call the church office 823-6344. If you need more vouchers you can get them from the church office.

The Easter Lilies cost \$7.00 each, and the cost of the other flowers is \$9.00 each. **Note, orders must be received by Tuesday, April 1st**. Make checks payable to the church. Order forms may be obtained from the church office, and there will be some on the East entry way table to pick up. You may take your plant home after the service Easter Sunday. Plants not picked up will be delivered to a shut-in.



MINUTE FOR MISSION

Upon the recommendation of the Worship Committee, Session unanimously voted at its March meeting to purchase the new Presbyterian hymnal, Glory to God! The Psalms are constantly calling us to sing new songs to the Lord. Music is a vital piece of our worship, and is a very special part of our worship here at Sunrise as such, our hymnals are important to our worship.


About once a generation, the Presbyterian Church releases a new hymnal, seeking to keep the best and favorites of what we've had, and adding some newer hymns. The new Presbyterian Glory to God hymnal follows that tradition, keeping about 60% of familiar hymns, and adding 40% new hymns. Included in that are our favorites from the current Presbyterian Hymnal, and our favorites from the Sing the Faith hymnal. They have also added in some old favorites from previous hymnals that were not included in our current Presbyterian Hymnal.

Some of the things that impressed us about the new hymnal was how much easier it was on the eyes, the brief notes on each hymn's meaning, and the organization of the hymnal. It also comes with an online version that will allow us to hear audio clips of hymns and to search for keywords, which will be a great help to those who choose hymns for worship plus Angie, our Secretary, will be able to simply cut and paste the words of each hymn into the Powerpoint instead of having to type all the hymns each week.

We will be purchasing 200 hymnals, at a cost of \$18.50 (\$17.50 + \$1 freight) per hymnal. We want to encourage you to provide funding for one or more hymnals in memory of or in honor of people who have touched your life. So go ahead and begin to think about people you might want to honor in this fashion – family members past and present, teachers, special friends, mentors, and others.

We have a couple of these new hymnals on the table in the narthex for you to see and forms are available so you can contribute to the hymnals and provide information about the persons you wish to have remembered or honored on a nameplate in the hymnal.

Watch for more information about when we will retire our old hymnals and dedicate the new ones!






HEIFER INTERNATIONAL TIDBITS


