

PRESBYTERY HIGHLIGHTS

JULY 18TH MEETING

The Presbytery of Northern Kansas met on Saturday, July 18, 2015 at the **Webster Conference Center** in **Salina, Kansas**. Following are the highlights of the meeting.

Introduced Teaching Elder **Rebecca Chancellor** (Designated Associate Pastor at **First Presbyterian Church, Salina**) as a new member of the Presbytery.

Heard from Ruling Elder **Vera White**, Associate for the **1001 New Worshiping Communities** initiative of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. Since 2012 when this was started, 279 new worshiping communities have been established in 113 presbyteries. 53% of the participants are racial ethnic and 64% are under the age of 40. You can learn more – and see the videos Vera showed at the meeting plus lots of others - at www.onethousandone.org.

Worshiped: Ruling Elder **Heath Rada**, moderator of the 221st General Assembly preached the sermon. Teaching Elders **Andy Sonneborn** (**Colby** and **Hoxie**) and **Katie Collins** (**Manhattan First**) presided at the celebration of the Lord's Supper. Andy also served as the liturgist.

Received an offering of \$706.25 for Living Waters for the World.

Ruling Elder **Heath Rada**, moderator of the 221st General Assembly described his experience as moderator and what he has learned during his travels and responded to questions from commissioners.

Celebrated the ordination anniversaries of: Rebecca Chancellor and Teresa Ingle (5 years); Suellen Wood (15 years); Stacey Shaffer Jones (20 years); Ken Jarvis and Kent Winters-Hazelton (30 years); Bob Frasier and Ed Thompson (35 years); Bryce Daniels and Mike Myers (40 years); Donald Ray (50 years) and Bob Freitag (60 years).

Learned that **Oasis**, a regional Christian Education event supported by the Synod of Mid-America will be held on **October 25-27** at the **Embassy Suites Plaza – Kansas City**. The theme is "Living the Gospel in the Post-Christendom World. The keynote speaker will be John Vest, Visiting Assistant Professor of Evangelism at Union Presbyterian Seminary, Richmond, VA. Chose Teaching Elder Chris Davis who serves the First Presbyterian Church, Phillipsburg as the winner of the Pastor's Appreciation Weekend.

Heard that **Authorized Pulpit Supply Training** will be held on the following Saturdays: September 12, October 17, and November 21 from 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM at the Presbytery Office. Cost is \$75 for the 3 sessions. RSVP ASAP – space is limited.

Introduced Ruling Elder **Kent Townsend** from **First Presbyterian Church**, **Topeka** as an Inquirer in the Commissioned Ruling Elder program.

Learned that the presbytery per capita for 2016 will remain at \$20.00. This will be the 8th year that the presbytery per capita has stayed at the same level.

Reported that the cost of a meal ticket for presbytery meetings will be increased to \$10.00 per ticket **and** that reservations will be required beginning with the October 2015 presbytery meeting to allow the host congregations to cover the meal expenses and to allow for a more accurate lunch count.

Elected Ruling Elder Bill Gannaway III (Topeka Westminster) to the Committee on Ministry, Teaching Elder Kent Winters-Hazelton (Lawrence First) as moderator of Presbytery Council, Teaching Elder Teresa Ingle (Wakarusa) as moderator of the Stewardship and Mission Committee, Teaching Elder FrankLyn Schroeder HR (Clifton/Oak Hill) as an ordination examination reader, and Teaching Elder Chris Davis (Phillipsburg) to the Committee on Representation.

Announced that there will be a **Youth Leadership Training Event** for all Youth Council Representatives August 7-8 at Webster Conference Center and that the **Fall Youth Rally** will be held October 17-18 at **Sunrise Presbyterian Church, Salina**.

Learned that **Rhoda Frasier** was installed as the moderator of the **Presbyterian Women of the Synod of Mid-America** and was recognized as one of the "**Women Making a Difference**."






