

Martha's Musings



This year's Presbyterian Women study book *Who Is Jesus? What a Difference a Lens Makes*, takes a broad overview of each gospel. Its focus is to examine the audience and context the different gospel writers intended to influence. The study has reminded us that the gospels were written at particular times in history for particular people. And while the gospel was written for people living long ago – the gospel still speaks to us in our particular time.

This year's lectionary readings will focus on Matthew's gospel. thew's intended audience is Jewish believers. He stresses over and over that Jesus' teaching opens the Kingdom of Heaven to us here and now. Matthew tells us about Jesus' birth in a very different story from Luke. Matthew's focus is on a powerful tyrant, King Herod, who wants to kill the baby. Herod does not want the child to challenge his throne. In Matthew, Jesus is born into a frightening web of political intrigue. Not long after his birth. Mary and Joseph are forced to flee the country with their new baby as refugees. They escape to Egypt and remain there until Herod died.

Every day, I read stories in the news about refugee families. This month

families continue to flee Syria. They often leave their homes with young babies or pregnant mothers. They take precious little with them. They risk



death in leaky rafts. They live in squalid conditions in refugee camps. They often lack food or medicine. Their pictures break our hearts.

I find it most apt that this year our Advent and Christmas readings come from Matthew's story about Jesus and his family becoming undocumented refugees. Mary and Joseph fled to Egypt much like refugees in our world. It would be likely that when they arrived in Egypt, the young family lived in some sort of refugee camp or slum. They had little. Herod wanted to kill their child. They did what they had to do to survive.

What a powerful message for us today! Imagine the baby Jesus in the middle of a leaky raft full of refugees. Imagine Mary and Joseph trying to get their son to safety. Imagine looking at the faces of the refugee babies we see in the news and seeing Jesus' face. Jesus spent his first years as a refugee. He is one of them. He is with them in their fear and hunger. He is with them as they search for home.

And he will be with us also in our fear and hunger. He will be with us in our joy and abundance. He will be with us reminding us that the Kingdom of Heaven is here among us right now – we simply have to open our eyes and see it!












A Christmas Poem


