AGENCY OF THE MONTH



The Salina Rescue Mission provides through Christian ministry food, clothing, shelter and other basic needs; and offers the rehabilitative teaching of Jesus.

During 2021, the Rescue Mission provided more than 50,000 meals and more than 22,000 nights of shelter.

Homelessness is their condition, not their identity. They are someone's son, grandson, brother, father, cousin, uncle, etc. They are real people-regardless whether we can understand how they got into their present situation. They may arrive at the Mission due to addiction, medical issues, mental illness, family conflicts or other issues.

Fighting homelessness is helping the person experiencing troubled times find who they really are, and helping them to overcome their situation with shelter, meals, medical help, job search support, and many other thinas.

Real, meaningful change is hard work and takes time. Thus, the Mission does not limit how long a person can stay at the Mission as long as he is actively working on his goals.



During this type of donation, red blood cells are separated from other blood components, and the plasma
and platelets are safely and comfortably returned to the donor.
