

Our Memories of Music, Advent and Christmas

Right now, before the culture explodes with the sights, smells, and sounds of the Christmas season, let's venture into our memory banks and retrieve some very special moments of Advent and Christmas seasons past. If you grew up in the church, what were some of your earliest memories of the weeks leading up to Christmas Eve? What memories still come flooding back, year after year? Are there songs you remember or tunes you associate with Advent, Christmas, and Christ's birth?

As children, and even now as adults, music helps us get into the Christmas spirit. As children there were songs learned for the Christmas program at school, those sung every week in Sunday School, and occasionally a program on Christmas Eve or the Sunday before Christmas at church. Band, orchestra, and choir concerts at school added to the memories. At home my dad played the guitar, and we sang, or we listened to his Christmas record collection. Fun times, good memories.

That was then, and this is now, but the memories are still very strong and powerful.

In an article on the Sennheiser website, we learn that "Music and its emotional impact therefore grows considerably with the memories and states of mind that we associate with it. And this is an area in which Christmas carols are naturally particularly strong. The unique moments associated with the holiday season are still considered by many people – even decades later – to be among the most beautiful of their childhood memories." This idea of "memories that we hold dear" should help us understand a bit better why it is that we celebrate Advent. We return to the beginning, and return to the stories that we have heard so well. And we listen again, so that we can also remember. Remember who God is. Remember why Christ was born. Remember that God is with us always. Remember that God loves us.

Christ is King, and yet does not ascend to the throne as one with privilege, but as a Servant Lord. We anticipate the reality of Christ's humility as we watch and wait during Advent for his coming birth in a humble stable, among smelly animals, and with a feeding trough as a bed. We see his parents who are humble also, having to provide for him in less than perfect circumstances. We recognize during Advent that God is with all of us, and that Christ will return in glory and power.

Friends, let us reflect on our memories of the seasons of Advent and Christmas past, even as we make new ones, to help us develop an attitude of prayer and thanksgiving for God's presence with us in Jesus Christ, as we begin to plan and celebrate his coming anew and forevermore. Amen.
