Martha's Musings

O Lord Our God, You are immortal, the creator and maker of all. We are mortal, formed of the earth, And to earth shall we return.

We use these words at every service of Witness to the Resurrection. We read them before we join together to sing our beloved "Alleluia." The words remind us of reality – of our human nature – of the fact that we all will die.

We've seen too much of death this winter both at Sunrise and in our larger community. Many of us have attended multiple funerals these past few months. We've grieved the loss of friends and family. We've known the pain that comes from losing those we love. Death is difficult – death is hard – and death is part of living.

Often, we are uncomfortable talking about death. Sometimes we really don't have words we can easily use. We struggle to talk with those we love. Other times when loved ones are ill, we may hold tightly to the promise of modern medicine to offer new life and cures when they may not prove helpful and might indeed offer more suffering. It's confusing to work through the maze of options – be they medical options or the choice of care facilities.

I read a book last year that helped me think more clearly about

these issues and choices: Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End, by Atul Gawande. In it, Gawande, a practicing surgeon and the son of two doctors, reveals his struggles to help his aging parents navigate medical and lifestyle choices. He includes the history of nursing homes. Gawande offers many suggestions for helping people stay in their own homes. He tells how even he as a doctor was confused by treatment plans suggested doctors when his father was diagnosed with cancer. Gawande found navigating these systems every bit as difficult as we all find them.

Gawande helps us talk about the importance and meaning of our lives. He raises questions for us about how we want to live. These questions are important when we are confronted with a new diagnosis or with failing abilities. I urge us all to read and discuss this book. It's engaging and important. It helps us claim the wonder of our lives and encourages us to live each day as fully as we can.

HE ALSO SERVES ON THE HUDSON RIVER PRESBYTERY'S STEWARDSHIP AND LEGACY TEAMS.

Prayer Notes


There's a loving letter I mean to write, There's a visit I mean to pay, There's a careless habit I hope to mend, When I get the time someday.
