Ongoing Mission

Souper Bowl of Hope 2023 is in progress! The goal for Salina is 57,000 cans! Don't forget to donate! At the Commodity Distribution, January 18, 68 families were served.

Every month, Sunrise provides support to the following agencies: \$100/month to Ashby House, Emergency Aid Food Bank, Salvation Army and Salina Rescue Mission; \$60/month to DVACK; \$40/month to CAPS; and \$50 to Salina Grace Resource.

Salina Agency of the Month

Salina Grace Resource Center

In the one year since Salina Grace Resource Center opened, 580 different individuals have been served. Many, but not all people who come to the Center are homeless. Some of them live on the edge of poverty, and are greatly supported by the available food and services provided by the Center.

They also check-in with individuals each week.

The Resource Center provides:

Continental Breakfast (bagels, fruit, coffee, cinnamon rolls, etc.)

Hot lunch meal, Monday-Friday, 11:30-12

Fridays: weekend food bags for the homeless

Services provided: Mental health screenings in coordination with Central Kansas Mental Health Center

Support with physical health issues in coordination with Salina Family Healthcare

Support for recovering lost/stolen birth certificates, identification cards

Support searching for housing

Support searching for employment (more than 80 individuals got jobs in 2022—80% of those still have their jobs)

Weekly contact with the persons who have contacted the Center to make sure they are all right.

Salina Grace will be moving into a new location in April or May. The new facility will have additional bathrooms, plus showers, laundry facilities, and offices for care managers and mental health case workers.

The Resource Center is under the umbrella of the Rescue Mission; and is funded by state and federal grants, community corrections, city grant funding, county grant funding and contributions. Sunrise is now providing \$50 every month.


