Sustaining a Community

I am grateful for each of you and for the love you bring to Sunrise, our members, friends, and community.

Someone expressed a desire to hear again the four parts of the Psalms of Lament that I spoke about in the sermon on Sunday. You may recall that more than one-third of the Psalms in the Bible are Psalms of Lament. When we need to share our deepest anguish, fears, and troubles with God, we can use the guidelines below. This list is shorter than the one in the sermon, so that it would fit into a compact space.

Prayers of Lament

Address God in prayer. Name and describe the One in whom you place your trust. Complaint. Express your pain and concerns to God. Speak your truth. Say why you are hurting. Petition. Request help or deliverance from God. Be brave and ask God for what it is you need. Expression of trust. Express your gratitude, faith and hope. Convey your trust that God will help.

You've heard "birds of a feather flock together." That saying is nothing like a theological statement, but it does describe the ways that birds and humans gather with others with common interests, goals, or challenges to form community. And community is a good thing! It's a wonderful way to receive support, to feel less isolated or "different than," even when there is a great deal of diversity among us.

We have so many interests! Making things to be given away as a sign of God's love, praising God with our voices and with instruments, raising funds to provide for many needs, encouraging children and hoping they feel our love, feeding our neighbors, welcoming new friends and sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In my short time at Sunrise, I have observed the deeply caring nature of this community. That caring nature is attractive, as it should be, for it reflects the love of God in Jesus Christ. I believe that our attractiveness takes shape and is evident in the generous and loving ways we treat others.

Look for the helpers.... A Fred Rogers quotable quote on Goodreads is probably one you're familiar with: "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, "Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." We become the helpers when we look out for those who are struggling, choose to put another's needs first, and make sacrifices for the common good.

Jesus was welcoming of everyone and spent a lot of time hanging out with those whom even our society today would frown upon. And while we do many things well, let's ask ourselves how we can be more expansive and welcoming of those who desire the love and acceptance that Jesus extends to all of us.

Thank you, Sunrise, for shining your light in the storm; for pouring the juice and serving the donuts; for allowing children to learn how to become servant leaders by actively participating in the worship of God; for gathering in community to love and serve each other and to become equipped to go out and love and serve others in the world. This is our mission and purpose: to CARE and SHARE in the name of Jesus Christ.

Thank you for your generous donations to the mitten tree. We distributed 7 scarves, 2 pairs of ear muffs, 24 pairs of socks, 12 pairs of girl's panties, 50 pairs of gloves and 101 stocking caps to Martin Luther King Day Care Center, CKF, Ashby House and Salina Grace/Salina Rescue Mission.

Sunrise recently partnered with several other churches to provide sack meals for the weekend for the un-housed that are eating at Salina Grace. Sunrise Mission Committee then gives the items to different places for children and adults. This is a well meaning project and helps the community so much.

SOUPER BOWL OF HOPE 2025

Paul is asking people to volunteer to help collect soup at the Cloud Street Dillons. Soup collections at Dillons will be February 1 and 2, and February 8, for 2 hour shifts. We were part of collecting 73,000 cans of soup last year (Soup and donations). The goal this year will be 59,000 cans for Souper Bowl 59. We want Sunrise to be part of the Souper Bowl of Hope 2025. \$30 will buy 50 cans of soup / \$60 will buy 100 cans. Any dollar amount is fine. If you write a check? Write it to Sunrise and write Souper Bowl of Hope 2025 on the memo line. Thanks!

UPDATE! The first weekend of the Souper Bowl of Hope was a success, collecting 3,652 cans of soup and \$2,186.42 in Cash!

Donations will stock the shelves at the Salina Emergency Aid Food Bank, Ashby House, The Salina Rescue Mission, DVACK, Salvation Army and Salina Grace!

Agency of the Month: Ellsworth Family Connections

As part of our Matthew 25 commitment ("I was in prison, and you visited me"), Sunrise supports Ellsworth Family Connections.

Ellsworth Family Connections Center was established to provide affordable, child-friendly and safe accommodations for families visiting inmates at Ellsworth Correctional Facility in the hope of preserving the prisoners' family units.

Rooms are rented out at the lowest rates possible. The facilities include small motel-like rooms, a safe, fenced-in playground, a shared kitchen, and food supplied by Ellsworth's food bank. All of this is to make family visits more affordable.

Studies show a direct correlation between positive family support and post-prison release success; and better offender mental health, behavior and rehabilitation while incarcerated.

Ellsworth Family Connections has been an important ministry since 1988; and is one of the very few programs of its kind in the nation. Sunrise is honored to share in this invaluable ministry to prisoners and their families!
