Martha's Musings

During my middle year at Austin Seminary, I applied to be a seminary participant at the National Conference of Christians and Jews in Chicago. I remember the trip well; it was my first visit to Chicago! (I also made my first visit to the Art Institute on that trip) There were about 20 Christian and Jewish seminarians from around the country. In small groups and over dinner, we got to know one another and learned about each other's faith traditions. Before that conference, I did not know much about the breadth of Jewish faith traditions. I was surprised to learn from my new friends that their traditions spanned the same range that Protestant faith traditions do. For me it was the beginning of a long engagement with inter -faith dialog.

For several years following that conference, I participated in a smaller NCCJ conference at Laity Lodge in Texas. About 25 stu-



dents from across the spectrum of our traditions would gather and discuss theology, scripture and share worship with one another. I learned a great deal from the rabbis who attended each year. I discovered that leadership in congregations is pretty much the same for Christians and Jews.

Across the years of my ministry I have drawn from these inter-faith experiences. I learned to listen carefully to others, ask questions to clarify what I did not understand, and state where I agreed or did not agree with my partners. God's Spirit was present and my faith grew. I learned to look for God in places outside the confines of "my" church.

In the past month, I've been thinking about these interfaith experiences. I wish Muslims or Hindu participants could have joined us because I would have liked to have learned from them. Given the events of the past month and the growing unrest concerning Islam in our country, I would really like to learn more about their practice and their faith.

My experiences taught me that not to judge a faith tradition from one aspect or small group of it. ALL faith traditions are broad – they have very literal and conservative branches and they have very liberal branches. ALL faith traditions have a sizable number of adherents in the "middle." My guess is that we could meet many Muslims who seem very similar to Presbyterians!



Presbyterians have a long history of inter-faith dialogue. I also encourage you to seek out other denominational sources to learn more. I have many of these in the office, and others are available on-line. It's easy to take the actions of a few and condemn an entire group. I urge us to look for God's presence in other faith traditions – in other people – indeed in the entire world. We never know what grace we might find!
