Sometimes it's hard to shine light on others. It was difficult this week at Sunrise. We were victim of yet another break in. They took our stock of sodas bashed up our soda machine and took a big box of potato chips. We've been cleaning up all week. We've talked with the police. We've talked with our insurance agent, and we've begun the task of replacing what was taken.

The one blessing in our burglary is that it reminds us what it feels like to be a victim. I've felt violated, angry and helpless

all week. Most victims of crime or bullying or oppression report feeling those same emotions. Our world is full of victims.

This Epiphany we'll look at how we can better shine light for those who find the world a dark place. Edith Wharton once wrote that "There are two ways of spreading light: to be the candle or the mirror that reflects it." How can we spread light? Join us in worship during January as we begin that conversation.
