# MARTHA'S MUSINGS ...




cs For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven

At almost every service of Witness to the Resurrection at Sunrise this year, the family has chosen this poem from Ecclesiastes to be read.

Life is made of seasons. It offers us a time to mourn and a time to dance – a time to weep and a time to laugh – a time to be born, and a time to die.

Paying close attention to the seasons of life helps us to reflect on God's presence in our lives. As we think of times we mourned, we can find evidence of the God's love holding us firm. As we recall times we searched

for deeper meaning, we can understand God's constant prodding to help us examine our world and our lives. As we grow older, it is helpful to look back on the seasons of our lives to discern the patterns.





Scripture: Romans 10:4-17

# MERGING FAITH AND SCIENCE WORLDVIEWS

But what does it say? "The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart."

Romans 10:8

The Collapse of the Three Story Universe, by Daniel Wolpert, reconciles two worldviews: (1) the Three Story Universe, a faith view of God as distant and "up," Hell as "down," us between and (2) the macro- and micro-universe, space-

time, revealed through science.

Both perspectives reveal the mind of God: creator and redeemer, in the beginning and ever present. Creation's details and processes inspire awe and creativity. Creation models symbiosis and interrelationship; everything is valuable (even essential) to the system. Creation is living, breathing, and growing, and so are we. We were created to be reformed, always reforming, as a part of life.

Action Step: Look up more information on ecosystems and interrelationships in nature.

God, thank you for wisdom, curiosity, intellect, and discernment. Grant us courage to break down walls within ourselves, build bridges with one another, and cast aside our limitations of you. Amen.

Scripture: Mark 6:1-13

## SHARING FAITH AND SCIENCE

"If any place will not welcome you . . . , as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them."

Mark 6:11

It is important for those with faith to share their faith to scientific colleagues and to explain to brothers and sisters in Christ that science and faith are not at odds with one another. It is important to dispel the stereotype of all scientists being atheists and to model finding common ground in a world of labels and finger-pointing.

So, that means that we have to look for opportunities to share what we believe, not for the purpose of conversion as much as to build relationships and heal rifts. Mark shows us that this is not always easy, and we may be rejected, but that doesn't mean we shouldn't

trv.

Action Step: Engage someone in conversation about the relationship between scientific knowledge and belief in God.

Lord, grant us wisdom to know your truth and the courage to share our faith honestly with others. Amen.


## "LIVING WATERS FOR THE WORLD" MISSION TRIP

How can you and/or your congregation be a part of the Presbytery of Northern Kansas Living Waters for the World mission?

#### 1. PRAY

Pray for safe water for all of God's children — pray for the Living Waters for the World program — pray for our PNK LWW Installations — pray for our participants as they are trained and as they serve as volunteers during our Installation Trips.

#### 2. JOIN US

Become a PNK LWW team participant — consider attending Clean Water University — consider becoming part of a team for an Installation Trip. More information about upcoming opportunities is available in the PNK Office.

#### 3. HELP SUPPORT OTHERS WHO ARE CALLED TO SERVE

Our Presbytery Council has approved the use of unrestricted endowment funds up to \$10,000 as matching funds to establish a scholarship fund for the PNK LWW program. Gifts from individuals and congregations for the PNK LWW Program will be matched dollar for dollar. The cost to the Presbytery for each installation averages \$8,000. Additionally, the cost to participants for Clean Water University Training is \$595 plus travel and the average cost to each team member on our Installation Trips is \$1500–\$1800. The vision of the scholarship fund is to help offset part of the cost for participants, the Presbytery hopes to set up this scholarship fund to provide scholarships for up to 1/3 of the cost and encourages the home congregation to consider paying 1/3 of the cost leaving 1/3 of the cost to the participant. Gifts for the PNK LWW Scholarship Fund can be sent to the Presbytery Office marked "PNK LWW Scholarship Fund."




