

School's out, summer's almost here, and it's time to kick back and enjoy June! But Sunrise has not slowed down for the summer – instead, we've gone into high gear.

CASTLE is in session Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. until noon. Carol Viar heads up CASTLE. This year there is a totally new staff of teachers bringing energy and excitement.

On June 15, just after River Festival closes, Heartland Traveling Day Camp comes to Sunrise for the second year. This year we have partnered with First Presbyterian Church to host camp. Camp runs from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. – except for Friday when children leave at 3:00 p.m.



Special thanks go out to the Nurture Committee and the Christian Education Committee. They've organized volunteers to provide counselors meals and to serve a snack to the camp each afternoon. It's going to be a busy month – but the entire church building will be in full use!

CASTLE and Heartland Traveling Day Camp are both wonderful opportunities for fellowship and education Sunrise offers to the children of Salina. Take time this month to stop by and enjoy the chatter and laughter of children filling our halls.



PRAYER NOTES

How Can | Pray?

A great way to pray is to look for God's presence in your life. More than 400 years ago St. Ignatius Loyola encouraged prayer-filled mindfulness by proposing what has been called the Daily Examen. The Examen is a technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to detect God's presence and to discern his direction for us. Try this version of St. Ignatius's prayer.

1. Become aware of God's presence. Look back on the events of the day in the company of the Holy Spirit. The day may seem confusing to you—a blur, a jumble, a muddle. Ask God to bring clarity and understanding.

2. Review the day with gratitude. Gratitude is the foundation of our relationship with God. Walk through your day in the presence of God and note its joys and delights. Focus on the day's gifts. Look at the work you did, the people you interacted with. What did you receive from these people? What did you give them? Pay attention to small things—the food you ate, the sights you saw, and other seemingly small pleasures. God is in the details.

3. Pay attention to your emotions. One of St. Ignatius's great insights was that we detect the presence of the Spirit of God in the movements of our emotions. Reflect on the feelings you experienced during the day. Boredom? Elation? Resentment? Compassion? Anger? Confidence? What is God saying through these feelings? God will most likely show you some ways that you fell short. Make note of these sins and faults. But look deeply for other implications. Does a feeling of frustration perhaps mean that God wants you consider a new direction in some area of your work? Are you concerned about a friend? Perhaps you should reach out to her in some way.

4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it. Ask the Holy Spirit to direct you to something during the day that God thinks is particularly important. It may involve a feeling—positive or negative. It may be a significant encounter with another person or a vivid moment of pleasure or peace. Or it may be something that seems rather insignificant. Look at it. Pray about it. Allow the prayer to arise spontaneously from your heart—whether intercession, praise, repentance, or gratitude.

5. Look toward tomorrow. Ask God to give you light for tomorrow's challenges. Pay attention to the feelings that surface as you survey what's coming up. Are you doubtful? Cheerful? Apprehensive? Full of delighted anticipation? Allow these feelings to turn into prayer. Seek God's guidance. Ask him for help and understanding. Pray for hope. St. Ignatius encouraged people to talk to Jesus like a friend. End the Daily Examen with a conversation with Jesus.

Ask forgiveness for your sins. Ask for his protection and help. Ask for his wisdom about the questions you have and the problems you face. Do all this in the spirit of gratitude. Your life is a gift, and it is adorned with gifts from God. End the Daily Examen with the Our Father.

In the afternoon, Parents will need to come inside to the registration table to sign out children. Those picking up children must have a picture ID.







The latest addition to Addie's Corner is "Morning Has Broken"

Summary: A beautifully illustrated rendition of the popular hymn, this book celebrates the beauty of God's creation through the eyes of a young boy and his grandfather who greet the day with smiles of wonder followed by an enjoyable walk in the park.

Literary elements at work in the story: People of all ages instantly recognize the memorable melody and powerful lyrics of this popular song as recorded by Cat Stevens in 1971. But few people know that the text (set to the traditional Scottish

Gaelic tune "Bunesan") was originally written some 40 years earlier in 1931 by British poet Eleanor Farjeon. Taking inspiration from Psalm 118:24, Farjeon wrote "Morning Has Broken" for a hymnbook entitled Songs of Praise and later included it in one of her collections of poems entitled <u>The Children's Bells.</u>
