It's fine when our finance are boring.


The chart below shows that our expenses (red line) have gone down each month since the first of the year. We have had no major expenses or surprises. That's good.

Our income (blue line) was lagging during the first 3 months but jumped up in April....maybe the quarterly giving statements being sent out were the inspiration. Our pledge offering, non-pledged, and loose offering are now running ahead of the budget. The "Other Income" line item are running behind, but that is normal as we don't get our check from the proceeds of our endowment until typically October, as an example. That's good.

Overall, one could say that our financials are good. And when financials are good, they can be boring.

On behalf of your church family at Sunrise, please accept this pocket prayer shawl created especially for you.


