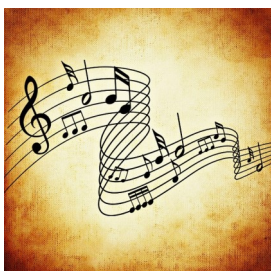

Please note there are special worship services that will take place during April:

- **APRIL 2, Sunday, Palm Sunday: Communion will not be celebrated during morning worship, but Sunrise will lead worship with Communion at Presbyterian Manor at 3pm
- **APRIL 6, Maundy Thursday service with Communion at 6pm
- **APRIL 7, Good Friday service at 6pm
- **APRIL 9, Easter Sunday service with Communion

Sunrise will host the Northern Kansas Presbytery meeting on Saturday, April 29. Many willing hands will be needed to provide the type of hospitality you are so excellent at offering to others. I hope you will volunteer to help or say “Yes” when asked!!

Ongoing Mission

Souper Bowl of Hope 2023 is in progress! The goal for Salina is 57,000 cans! Don't forget to donate! At the Commodity Distribution, January 18, 68 families were served.

Every month, Sunrise provides support to the following agencies: \$100/month to Ashby House, Emergency Aid Food Bank, Salvation Army and Salina Rescue Mission; \$60/month to DVACK; \$40/month to CAPS; and \$50 to Salina Grace Resource.

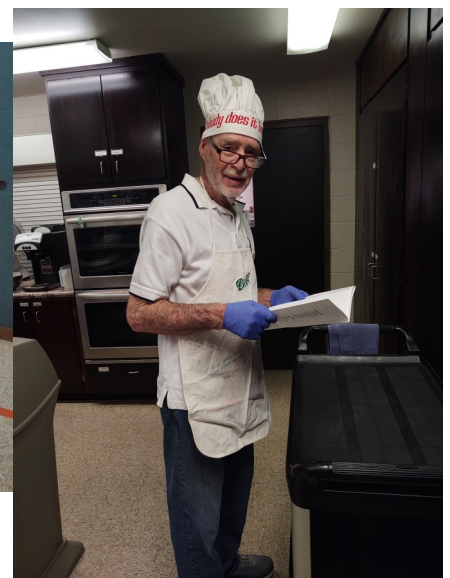

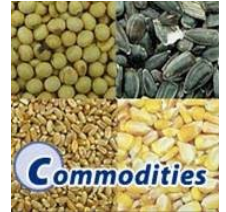
DISASTER FOOD GIVEAWAY & COMMODITIES
