

PREPARING OUR HEARTS AND MINDS FOR LENT

It's amazing what we can learn. Opening our hearts and minds to others and their experiences of life can have a powerful and sometimes intense effect on our own lives.

Lent is a similar time of awakening; a time to allow life to slow down, to look at things differently, and to be with God in new ways. It is a time to consider hope and life and commitment to God, and to notice how God might be pruning or teaching each of us. Before planting flowers, vegetables, or ideas, the soil must first be tended and nourished and prepared.

That's the Season of Lent. A time to get ready. A time to prepare ourselves. A time to meet God where we are. A time to let God prepare us for what lies ahead.

A mysterious epidemic from 1915 to 1926 known as "Sleeping Sickness" called Encephalitis Lethargica had many people puzzled. Over one million people contracted Encephalitis Lethargica and resulted in over 500,000 deaths. Many of those who survived did not resume their previously active lives or return to normal health. Instead, most of them remained in a statue-like condition, speechless and motionless.

Watching the 1991 Netflix movie "Awakening," starring Robin Williams and Robert De Nero, I learned that the movie is based on neurologist Oliver Sacks' book by the same name. "They would be conscious and aware – yet not fully awake;" wrote Sacks. "They would sit motionless and speechless all day in their chairs, totally lacking energy, impetus, initiative, motive, appetite, affect or desire; they registered what went on about them without active attention, and with profound indifference. They neither conveyed nor felt the feeling of life; they were as insubstantial as ghosts, and as passive as zombies." (p. 14).

Sacks did a trial with a therapy being used for Parkinson's Disease, at much higher dosages. And miraculously, the treatment caused patients to come alive! Those previously motionless patients could smile and talk with each other! They could dance and converse with their fellow patients! They could feed themselves and be able to make lists of things to buy! They could even go out into the public square and were able to shop, take public transportation, hold hands and fall in love.

While the therapy worked, it had been a time of celebration and joy and relationship building that we all take too much for granted. Sadly, the medication finally stopped working and their bodies returned to that motionless state. A huge gift that the experience gave to the caregivers was the renewed commitment to always treat every person --patient or staff-- with respect and kindness. Staff care and respect for their patients was transformed. Friendships blossomed. Life was cherished. People were esteemed highly.

During this Season of Lent, how will your hearts and minds be prepared to welcome the risen Christ into your life? What small steps do you need to take to be intentional about your Christian faith and the ways that your service and love radiate out to include the sick, the hungry, the lost, the poor? Who are you holding in your heart today who needs some extra TLC? Who has God laid on your heart to care for?

STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE

Understanding the 2024 Budget

The 2024 budget was approved by the Session in their January meeting. Major changes from the 2023 budget are highlighted below:

Income:

- A) Pledges are up from \$174K to \$181K.
- B) We have \$8207 in prepaid pledges. These are contributions received in 2023 for 2024. We will draw 1/12 of this amount out each month to the operating budget.
- C) The cash carryover line item was eliminated. Last year it was a little over \$42K, which allowed us to show a balanced budget, even though it was not. By eliminating this line item, the 2024 budget has a \$37K deficit, which is a more realistic view of our budget and finances.

Expenses:

- A) Insurance premiums have increased.
- B) We anticipate utility charges to increase.
- C) A 3% lump sum payment will be given to our employees in February in lieu of a permanent wage increase. It has been since 2020 since our employees have seen an increase. We wanted to acknowledge their efforts over the last few years.
- D) Heartland Day Camp was eliminated., There was \$700 in the 2023 budget, but actual expenses were a little over \$2000. First Presbyterian Church will be hosting the Day Camp this year. Please check with them if you have kids or grandkids who might like to attend.
- E) Our giving to Presbytery Mission was reduced from \$14,800 to \$11,443.

Of note:

Pastor Deb's contract terms are the same in 2024 as they were in 2023, although she will enjoy the 3% lump sum mentioned above.

If you have any questions about the 2024 budget, please feel free to ask myself or any member of the Finance Committee.

MATCH MADNESS

Match Madness will take place on March 21 at the Salina Fieldhouse. It is an opportunity to give to the endowment fund of many local nonprofits and Sunrise Presbyterian Church is one of them.

What is an endowment fund, you ask? Endowment funds are a type of investment fund held by nonprofit organizations such as universities, churches, museums, and other charities. The donations inside the fund usually stay invested forever, and only the earned interest is available to be pulled out and spent each year. In other words, we can't touch the principle, but can withdraw (within the guidelines) the investment gains and interest.

A donation made on March 21 will be added to our endowment fund held at the Greater Salina Community Foundation (GSCF). For every dollar given **that day** to the endowment fund, there is a possible match of up to 50%. As an example, if we received \$2000, the match could be \$1000. The matching amount is determined after the event. We have our choice of having the matching amount sent to us for our operating budget or to be invested in our endowment fund.

As of our last statement, we currently have \$309,490 in the Sunrise endowment fund. Per our agreement with GSCF, we can pull out up to 5% of the net fair market value of the fund, valued as of the first day of each year. In September 2023, we received a check for \$16,712 from the GSCF and the fund.

It may seem like a slow and boring way to invest, but over time it ends up being a good revenue stream for Sunrise.


