MARTHA'S MUSINGS.



The joy and newness of the Easter season unfolds for us as the trees leaf out and the peonies come to bud. We find the shells of Robin's eggs in the lawn, we look for our beloved Orioles to come, and we ponder the turkey vultures every evening as they circle down to their roosts. Spring unfolds and brings a new freshness. Likewise Easter brings us new hope, new joy, and new possibilities for living the resurrection life. Poet Wendell Berry penned the line, "Practice Resurrection."

How do we practice resurrection? For Berry practicing resurrection involves loving the world, people, animals and caring for them. Berry recommends that every day we "do

something that won't compute" in the scheme of living to make money – but that will compute in the scheme of loving and caring for the world.

One way we are practicing resurrection at Sunrise this Easter is through the New Beginnings program. On Ash Wednesday, at the beginning of Lent, over sixty of us gathered at Sunrise to imagine how we might *practice* resurrection in Salina. We began by telling our story of mission and passion. We talked about important moments when God touched our lives. We remembered events that moved us and actions we found empowering. Our words that evening were recorded and together with information from our assessor formed into a report which can offer us a reflection of ourselves.

We'll take a look at that reflection, together, in Cottage Gatherings held in May and June. Your Session members will be hosting meetings at 6 different locations and times. These gatherings will meet approximately once a week for six weeks. Some groups may skip a week or two – but all groups will finish meeting by the end of

June. It is important that group members attend all the

meetings and participate fully.

One of the central questions that will be asked in the gatherings is "What is our passion at Sunrise?" What is it that we are passionate about? What is it do we do really well, love doing well and others need us to do? These gatherings are really conversations about our passion, our mission and our community.

What an exciting way to practice resurrection! We are invited to share in a joint conversation over six weeks. We have the opportunity to come to better know one another and to share our faith at a deeper level. The gatherings offer us time for positive visioning and brainstorming.

It's Easter. It's time to practice resurrection. Let's all sign up for a Cottage Gathering and look forward to the conversation!









Presbyterian Disaster Assistance responds to earthquake disaster in Nepal

The death toll from the massive earthquake in Nepal continues to rise. Nearly 4,000 are known dead and more than 6,000 were injured when the 7.8 quake struck just west of the capital of Kathmandu on April 25. The quake, the worst in more than 80 years, along with many serious aftershocks has also



caused damage in parts of India and Bangladesh.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short–term recovery in the impacted areas with our partner, ACT Alliance and its members who are already on the ground. Immediate response will help provide needed food, water, supplies and medicine to the impacted towns and villages. As long term recovery plans are developed, PDA will accompany and further financially support our partners in the area to insure that a comprehensive recovery is sustained.

PRESBYTERY OF NORTHERN KANSAS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS APRIL 21, 2015



The Presbytery of Northern Kansas met Tuesday, April 21, 2015 at the First Presbyterian Church of Ellsworth, Kansas. Following are the highlights of the meeting.

Introduced four new members of the presbytery: Teaching Elder Kati Collins, interim associate pastor at First Presbyterian Church, Manhattan; Teaching Elder Debra Garber, designated pastor at West Side Presbyterian Church, Lawrence; Teaching Elder Charles Smith III, pastor, First Presbyterian Church, Salina; and Teaching Elder Peg Ziser, H.R.

Examined three inquirers **Christine Wagner**, a member of **First Presbyterian Church**, **Hays** and a second year student at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary; **Ryan Gaffney**, a member of **First Presbyterian Church**, **Wamego** and also a second year student at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary; and **Joaquin Anabe**, a member of **First Presbyterian Church**, **Topeka** and a second year student at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and approved that all three be received as candidates for ordination as teaching elders under the care of the Presbytery of Northern Kansas.

Worshiped: Teaching Elder Helen Hutchison, designated pastor of Trinity Presbyterian Church, Manhattan preached the sermon. Ruling Elder Steve Boor, First Presbyterian Church, Sylvan Grove served as the liturgist. Helen Hutchison and host pastor, the Rev. Amy Jo Hawley, designated pastor of First Presbyterian Church, Ellsworth were co-celebrants for the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Received an offering of \$854.42 for the ministry of the **Heartland Presbyterian Center**.

Watched a brief video on the Confession of Belhar. (The video and other resources on the Confession of Belhar can be found at http://oga.pcusa.org/section/ga/ga221/ga221-belhar/.)

Approved 5 amendments to the constitution by voice vote:

Amendment 14-B-1 Final Assessment – On Amending G-2.0607 Amendment 14-B-2 Accommodations – On Amending G-2.0610

Amendment 14-C Child Protection Policy

Amendment 14-D Minimum Composition of a Presbytery – On Amending G-3.0301

Amendment 14-E Interreligious Stance – On Amending G-050102

Participated in breakout groups to look at Amendment 14- A, Renunciation of Jurisdiction – On Amending G-2.0509 and Amendment 14-F, Marriage – On Amending W-4.9000.

Had a great lunch featuring beef brisket, cheesy potatoes, green beans, rolls, and cookies.

Gave permission to First Presbyterian Church, Smith Center to offer their manse for sale, announced that grants from the Building and Property Maintenance Fund had been given to First Presbyterian Church, Hoxie; United Presbyterian Church, Belleville, and First Presbyterian Church, Concordia; and notified presbytery that there were two additional guidelines for these grants: 1) applications are to be made preferably in advance of the start of the project but not later than 6 months after completion and 2) churches may receive up to two grants within 5 years but there must be at least one year's time between grants.






