THE MONTH OF MAY LEADS INTO PENTECOST

Easter is not just one day of the year, but the joyful remembrance of Christ's Resurrection that we celebrate every Sunday of the year! The celebration of Christ's Resurrection helps us remember again and again that God makes all things new; that in Christ, what was once lost is found; and what was once destroyed is redeemed. The marks on his hands and feet are still visible but healed. And all the wounds that we have experienced in this life will be healed by his faithful love.

So we look ahead to new life, led and inspired and called by Christ to work for the redemption of the world. Whether it is an outreach ministry we are participating in, or a hands-on project, or even a new ministry that shares God's love in Jesus Christ, how will you be renewed in your commitment to sharing his love in the world? What opportunities excite you to do ministry in his name?

Here are some ordinary ways that you can continue to be Christ's disciple!

- Pray for our community: the neighborhood surrounding the church, our city and county, and those you know who need prayer. Share your prayer concerns with the list that is distributed to members.
- Continue to worship with your church family, in person or online or by email. Your presence with another person may be just what they needed and wanted to hear.
- Celebrate and share in all the occasions of your church family's lives: birthdays, anniversaries, travel plans, and personal struggles. Birthdays and anniversaries are listed in the membership directory and also in each month's newsletter. Call or email anyone who you deem to be worth celebrating!
- Share your joys and concerns! If you are in worship, note them on the back of the attendance card. Celebrate and share the special little moments in your life.

On May 9, 2024, (Thursday) we will not celebrate, but will observe Ascension Day. This will mark the 40 days of Jesus' reign on earth after his resurrection and calls us to remember that he promised to send the Holy Spirit to the disciples within a few days. They will excitedly wait for the Spirit to come upon them.

On May 19, 2024, we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost with several activities. Patti Breeding will read a story from the archives about our beginnings in 1954. We will honor Louise Simcox, our only charter member, who will be here for the event. There will be other "fun" things happening that day, as well.

On May 26, 2024, we will be having an election to replace Betty Kerr on the Board of Deacons. This election will take place on the weekend after Pentecost, or Memorial Day Sunday. We hope you will be able to be there to cast your vote and to see someone be installed as a Deacon.

We are the body of Christ and called to serve him. Each gentle act or large gesture is just one more way we can express his faith, hope, and love for others. 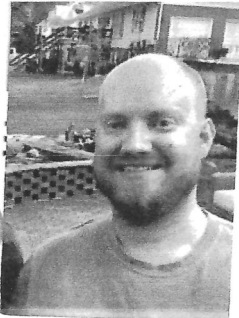
MORNING & AFTERNOON CIRCLES

The Afternoon Circle will meet at Katie Weis' home at 2:00 pm.



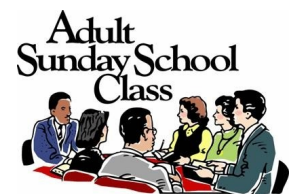

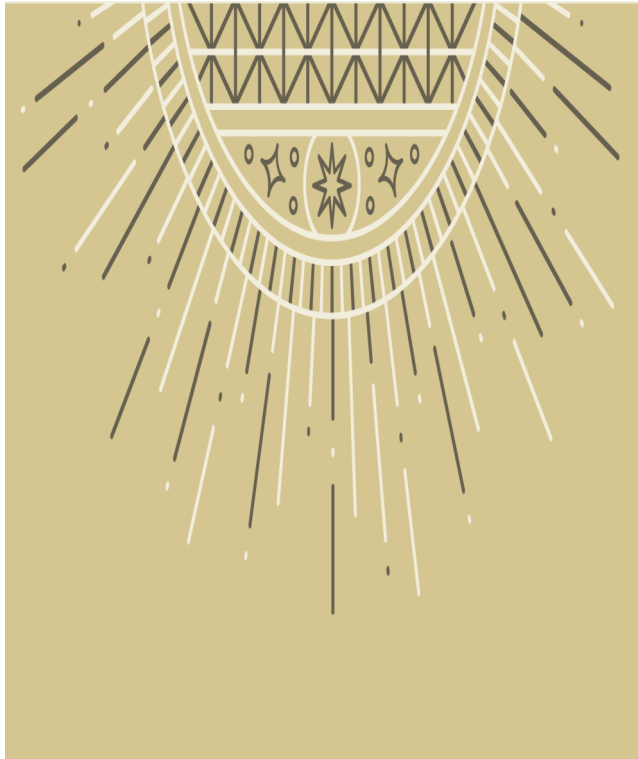
70th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

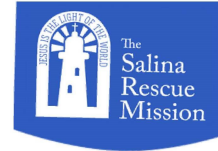

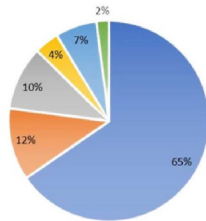

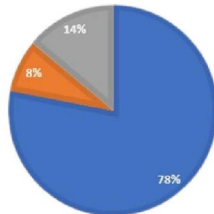
2023 Fiscal Year Revenue by Source

Did You Know?

If you've reached the age where you need to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) from your traditional IRAs, you can avoid paying taxes on the money by donating it to charity.

We all have a story. We have a building full of stories.

Most of the stories in our building consist of trauma that started in childhood, struggles with physical health issues, mental illness, loss of family, and addictions.

Fortunately, we have great friends like you to help our homeless neighbors in their time of need. You are playing a major role in helping them re-write their stories from tales of tragedy to stories of triumph.

You are helping re-write their stories by providing food, clothing, and shelter to meet their basic needs. You are giving them a place where it is safe to address the root issues that led them to us in the first place.

You are loving your neighbor as you provide funds for doctor visits and prescription medications. In 2023, you helped 134 individuals see a doctor and provided 273 prescription medications for those who needed them.

You helped 29 men who were struggling with addictions or other life-controlling issues to start putting their lives back together with God at the center through our New Life Program.

You empowered 199 men to get full-time jobs through our Employment Program, in addition to providing them with classes and personalized counseling to learn how to manage their money.

In 2023, you helped 501 men who were experiencing homelessness have an experience with God's love through your support. Thank you for making this a life-transforming year for many in our community.

MATCH MADNESS RESULTS

On behalf of the Stewardship and Finance committee, I would like to thank all 20 of you who donated to the endowment fund during Match Madness. The donations totaled \$1800. The match for Sunrise is 50% this year, so another \$900 will go into our fund. This makes the grand total of a \$2700 increase to the fund.

Our operating fund will increase by \$60 due to Sara Orr's free throw shooting skills plus another \$10 as one of the Saline County 5th graders picked Sunrise as their charity of choice.

Tornado Survival Tips - Lessons Learned

Julie and I (Dave Parks) lived in Shawnee, OK in 1999 which is about 30 minutes east of Oklahoma City. A tornado hit OKC in May of that year and one of the folks who worked for me had his house destroyed while he was taking shelter in it!! He and his family sought shelter in their bathroom that was in the middle of the house. When they came out of that bathroom, the only walls of his house still standing were the walls of the bathroom they were in!

Shortly after his ordeal he composed these tips and lessons learned. I think they still apply today.

- 1) WEAR SHOES! You will be walking on broken glass, nails, and splintered wood when you come out of the ruins of your home.
- 2) Be fully clothed. It may get cold. And it may be all you are left with.
- 3) Keep your purse and wallets with you in your tornado shelter. You will need your driver's license to go back to your home. Also, you'll need cash, credit cards and ATM cards. And don't forget prescriptions.
- 4) If you have beepers and cell phones - keep them with you. It may be the best way to get in touch with friends and family, especially if you end up in three different shelters.
- 5) DO NOT GET SEPARATED FROM YOUR FAMILY! Our daughter-in-law wandered away trying to get to her house. My wife left her to try and get back me (I was helping neighbors who were trapped in their house). My daughter-in-law, with her baby and my little boy ended up in one shelter, my wife was forced to evacuate before she reached home and ended up at Tinker Air Force base. I ended up in a church where my son, by pure chance, found me within an hour.
- 6) Place your important documents in a duffle bag or backpack and have the bag with you at all times (Dave adds - plus your phone charger).
- 7) AVOID bathrooms with exterior walls!! Our bathroom in the main bedroom was destroyed when the exterior wall collapsed into it. We survived in the bathroom in the hallway.
- 8) If you have a garage, KEEP YOUR CARS INSIDE THE GARAGE. If your garage is full of junk (like most people's) either get rid of the junk or buy a storage building for it. Our two cars survived, messed up, but in working order. The garage was destroyed, but it absorbed the force of the winds. All cars in the neighborhood that were outdoors are now upside down in somebody else's yard or twisted about somebody's tree.
- 9) If you are buying or building a house, AVOID BRICK CHIMNEYS! Ours fell into our living room. A wooden one would have flown harmlessly away.
- 10) If you are building a home, GET A SHELTER WITH REINFORCED CONCRETE WALLS. And a strong ceiling as that is the first thing to go. Get extra wood over you so it will be harder to destroy.
- 10) I don't know if this is good advice, but I am not planning to stay at home again watching on television for half an hour with a tornado coming towards me. I could not convince my wife to get in the van and head for Guthrie. My neighbor was killed when a car was blown from the street and fell on top of his house, right over the room where he and his wife were taking shelter (his wife did survive). If the tornado had rolled right over my house, none of us would have survived. But leave only if you know you will not be trapped in traffic.

FLORIDA PROJECT

The Florida Project is a 2017 American drama film directed by [Sean Baker](#) and written by Baker and [Chris Bergoch](#). The plot focuses on the summertime adventures of a six-year-old girl who lives with her unemployed single mother in a budget motel in Kissimmee, Florida. Their struggle to make ends meet and stave off homelessness takes place in an environment dominated by the nearby Walt Disney World. It juxtaposes this with the local residents' less glamorous day-to-day lives, and also the children's joyful adventures as they explore and make the most of their surroundings, while remaining blissfully ignorant of the true hardships which their adult caretakers face. Both the National Board of Review and the American Film Institute chose the film as one of the top ten films of the year.



MISSION COMMITTEE INFORMATION



In March Sunrise collected money for One Great Hour of Sharing. Thanks to all who donated. The total of dollars will be sent to the Presbyterian Mission Agency for hunger and disaster assistance.

During April Sunrise collected lingerie items for the women at CKF, Ashby House and DVACK.

Project Salina kicked off on April 18 and will continue until the end of May. Sunrise is collecting cans or packets of tuna. A cash donation of \$25 will buy 25 cans of tuna. If you wish to write a check, be sure to put "Project Salina" on the memo line.

The Pentecost offering will be collected in May to help provide opportunities for young people to grow and share in their faith in Christ. 40% will be kept by Sunrise and 60% will be sent to the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Youth who have been active participants at Sunrise are eligible for a post-secondary education scholarship form Sunrise. Students who have graduated from high school and who will enroll in career and tech-ed programs, colleges or universities for the 2024-2025 school year are eligible. Lead Us On to the Light Nebraska Wesleyan University Choir Tour

The Nebraska Wesleyan University Choir and Jazz Choir culminate their 2023-24 season with a concert tour entitled "Lead Us On to the Light." Their performance in this area will take place on May 5, 2024, at Sacred Heart Cathedral. Inspired by a phrase from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s favorite hymn ("...lead me on to the light"), this eclectic and illuminating program features music by Rosephanye Powell, Moses Hogan, Maurice Duruflé, Heinrich Schütz, and Dolly Parton. Tom Trenney's arrangement of "We Shall Overcome" and U2's haunting "MLK" are sure to be highlights of this powerful program.

Having recently performed at Carnegie Hall, the 65-voice Nebraska Wesleyan University Choir has been named a finalist in the American Prize for Collegiate Choirs. Nationally celebrated concert pianist, organist, and composer Anne Wilson will serve as accompanist for the tour performances.

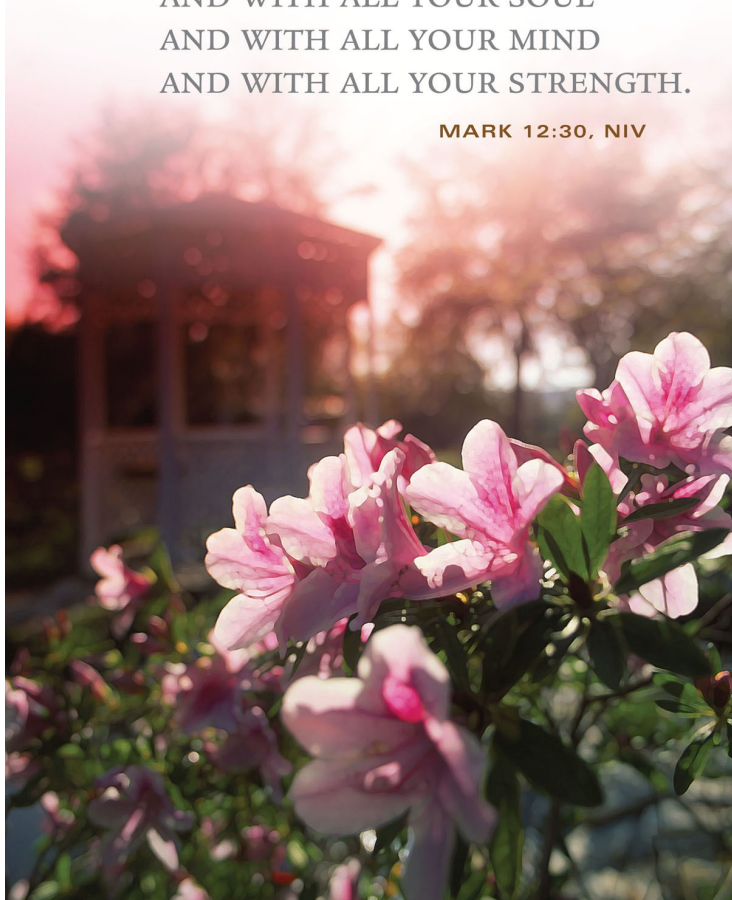
