In Honor of You

A Gift in Honor of YOU

In Romans, Chapter 12, Paul says that by God's grace we are called into one body, the church. God's grace calls us to offer ourselves to God in service with the unique gifts that each of us has. Paul lists the various ways that each of us contributes to the whole body with our individual gifts.

Recently, I saw you serving the body of Christ at a funeral. I noticed that you, the people of Sunrise, work together in this gathered community to achieve the goal of serving others in Christ's name. I noticed many of you helping in some way at the funeral, in different roles, giving all your effort to making the family feel as welcome and cared for as possible. It was an honor to witness you serving others with such joy.

After the service, I sat down to write a "Thank You" in the form of A GIFT IN HONOR OF ______. You've seen the yellow form that we are invited to fill out when we want to honor someone. But once I began, the list of those I wanted to honor kept growing. It grew longer and longer because you are generous about contributing your time, energy, love, commitment, and compassion to serving families in a time of loss. I see you serving in the background, in the quiet tasks of preparing the meal, running errands, making arrangements, putting letters on a banner. Often actions may be largely unseen but are still felt so significantly. Below is a list of names that came to mind as I wrote this article. I thank you and honor you. Please know that I am certain that there are other names to be added, and I thank and honor you, as well.

Worship Committee (Steve Ewing, Mark Zimmerman, Sylvia Phillips, Deena Horst, Clarke Sanders, and Matt Schwan) fills the candles on the chancel, displays the memorial name banner, and provides leadership.

The inspiration for the memorial name banner came from Faye Morris who, along with Katie Weis and Betty Legge, designed, appliqued, and quilted it. Since 2003, Sunrise members who have died have been named on that banner, affirming the word of the Lord in Isaiah 43:1 – "I have called you by name, you are mine!"

Technology assistance is occasionally provided by one of the "team" – Kenny Hancock, Jack Gillam, or Mark Zimmerman. This might include running a video or slide show of family photos, assisting with microphones, making sure all the sound equipment is functioning properly, and more.

Soloists or special music may be chosen by the family, and, as often as she is able, Sue Will has consistently graced us with her wonderful talent at the piano or organ. She provides just the right balance to help transition from one part of the service to another, including the beautiful and meaningful "Alleluia."

Katie Weis also shares her gifts by designing artistic centerpieces for the tables in the Multipurpose room. She does this all year round, but her efforts make the MPR an extra special place for grieving families.

The Deacons are a dedicated ministry of Sunrise and, with the Sunrise Nurses, provide compassionate care to our members. The Deacons provide a meal to be served following a funeral, consulting with the family for any special preferences. A Deacon greets family and guests as they arrive for the funeral. Nurses provide compassionate care in loving ways, often behind the scenes.

Sharon Herrington works in the background sharing bereavement materials with the family after the loss of their loved one. Pamphlets on different topics are mailed at intervals during the first year. These materials provide comfort, education, and connection to Sunrise, while also letting the family know we care.

Greg Kerr and the Building and Grounds Committee (Sharon Hauser, Jack Gillam, Blaine McAfee, Kevin Cool, and Kenny Hancock) maintain a clean, attractive building in which to celebrate the life of a family's loved one, and to receive the condolences of those who attend. Greg goes the extra mile to set up the MPR so each family is able to pay tribute to their loved one with memorabilia, photos and occasionally a slide show.

Edie Hurtig and her office volunteers assist with printing and folding bulletins, coordinating details with family, florists, funeral home, and others, and maintaining a warm and welcoming atmosphere.

The Memorial Committee provides information to families about the Memorial Tree. Families may wish to honor their loved one with a special inscription on a leaf which is then added to the tree. A family may also choose to designate a memorial to Sunrise Presbyterian Church in memory of their loved one. Memorial Committee members are Jack Gillam, Abner Perney, Sylvia Phillips, Paul McAfee, and Jane Alsop. The Memorial Committee and the Session are responsible for the stewardship of all memorial gifts.

Generous acts of hospitality are provided to the family by a team of two that we call "Ushers." Both Tom and Sylvia Phillips, for many years; and Pat and Patti Breeding, for about the last year, work tirelessly behind the scenes to help families feel welcome and cared for before the funeral service begins, and assist with tasks at the end of the service. Many little things are done behind the scenes as an act of hospitality. For instance, they prepare the sanctuary for an urn or casket, for photographs and flowers; set up the sound system when a tech person is not present; and provide ice water and hospitality in the Parlor. These acts of hospitality free the family to greet people during a visitation and/or gather together for quiet time before the service begins. Ushers have a wide variety of duties and are often some of the last to depart after the service concludes.

This "In Honor of ..." tribute would not be complete without giving honor to Betty Kerr. In the year between pastors (2022), Betty and others tirelessly and quietly guided Sunrise in taking care of families at the time of their loved one's death. She met people where they were, helped them make decisions and gave them comfort. By the time of my arrival, Betty had researched guidelines for funeral planning and the Session adopted the one we now use. These guidelines help us serve grieving families with love and compassion.

It is a joy to assist families to prepare for a funeral at Sunrise. Your dedication to being good stewards of your resources and opening your hearts and the church building to welcome families at a time of loss is a true gift. Thank you for serving families selflessly when a Sunrise member has died. God turns our humble offerings into expressions of love, and the love you have for others is so healing for them. They will long remember your welcome, the time you spent, the attention you gave to the details, and the respect and honor you gave to both them and their loved one. You wear the yoke of Christ well. It is with awe and thanksgiving that I honor you for your love and service to others in Christ's name.





- Tony will lead a Pastor's Retreat for PNKS at Acorns Resort, Milford Lake on May 6th.


