

- The Fellowman International Fundraiser will now be November 12th at 4pm at First Methodist Church. No meal, only cookies, no auction. This will be an informational event, but pledge cards will be available. Lisa Armstrong will speak to us that morning. We will try to get Lisa to visit us sometime, so we, SPC, can get to know her and her mission again. We will try to get her to preach to us some Sunday.

- The second Alzheimer's disease Education will be November 13th.

- Items (personal hygiene) are being collected for the Central Kansas Mental Health Center.

- The Castle Pumpkin Sale went great; \$1,500 to \$2,000 was raised.

- Football has started, that means Souper Bowl of Hope is in a few months.

- We are beginning plans for the 2018 Mission Trip to Central America; more information to come. If interested let us know. - Back in July and August we collected 124 pairs of socks for DVACK and Ashby House.

- Castle had another great summer. 70 to 75 children attended every day. This summer, Castle had a youth aid that was a Castle kid when Castle started years ago.

- The Mission Committee and Building and Grounds Committee will join forces and organize a church cleaning party some Sunday after church; more information on this.

- The next Commodity Distribution will be November 15th.

- Watch our bulletin board by the CE Office door; more Mission information is there.

- Keep in mind Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). When there is a disaster anywhere PDA will be there. If you want to donate, write the check to Sunrise and write disaster on the memo line. Your donation will get there to help. We stuffed 22 buckets of cleaning supplies on October 1st.

- We will help the Ashby House Christmas Events and needs. We will see what they need.

- We are looking for more committee members. We meet the 1st Monday of the Month. If you are interested let us know!





Fellow Man International Mission of Honduras

Lisa Armstrong and Dr. Samira Villela will bring a progress report of Fellow Man International Mission of Honduras on November 12, at 4:00 pm, in the Fellowship Hall of First United Methodist Church, Salina. This free event will feature verbal and photographic presentations, a light dessert and an opportunity to provide sustaining support for the mission. Tickets available on

the door of the church office and from individuals will be used to help planners prepare for the event.

Lisa Armstrong left her position at the Salina Regional Health Center in 1998 where she was a surgical nurse to assist in the recovery after Hurricane Mitch swept through Honduras. She saw the need for medical service in the northern mountainous region and set-about to establish health assistance. The results have been the establishment of a clinic with a physician, nurses and equipment; a model farming operation that grows vegetables for sale and barter; a meat program that raises chickens and hogs for dietary supplement; and



support for the local public school through a hot-lunch program, support for a teacher and construction for the increased enrollment. A new nutritional program in recent years has been that of developing community gardens.


