## **World Communion Sunday**

The first Sunday in October is designated as **World Communion Sunday**, which "celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world." (1) **This year on October 1** we will celebrate the Lord's **Supper** with other Christians in many different denominations around the world.

The first Worldwide Communion Sunday celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. In an excerpt from the October 7, 2002, issue of Presbyterian Outlook, John A. Dallas, a PCUSA pastor who has researched the history of World Communion Sunday, notes the following in his blog post:

Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that **Dr. Kerr** first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. When I asked Donald Kerr how the idea of World Communion Sunday spread from that first service to the world wide practice of today, this is what he replied, (2)

"The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ." (2)

World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted by Presbyterians (PCUS) in 1936 and churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us. It wasn't until 1940 that an organization that is now the National Council of Churches promoted it, that it became a widespread practice.

"Today World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, transcending boundaries of denomination, geography, and language." (1)

## AGENCY OF THE MONTH WOMEN HELPING WOMEN




Women Helping Women is an established fund through Greater Salina Community Foundation. This fund was created to fund relatively small items for women and their families who fall between the cracks of services provided by other local agencies.

Grants cannot exceed \$750. In the past fiscal year, WHW funded beds, car repairs, tires, dentures, teeth extractions, bed bug extermination, second hand washers and dryers, home security systems (domestic violence case), licensure fees and technical school tuition. The total of the 66 grants awarded was \$39,971.88.

A donation of \$500 over a 2-year period will enable you to become a Fairy Godmother. Women/girls under 30 will become Tinkerbells with a \$250 donation.
