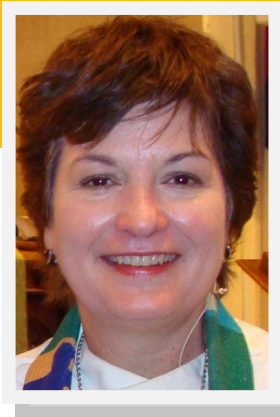

Martha and the Christian Education Committee will still be overseeing the administration of our youth programs. Please see one of them if you have a question, need or would like to volunteer.



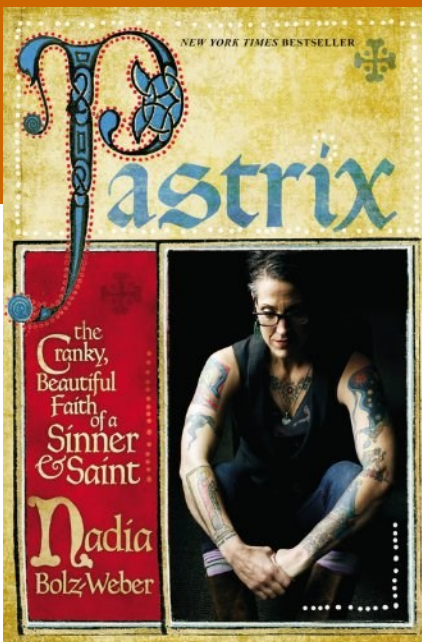

Thanks for your support of Fellow Man International. This letter will give information regarding the progress of the Mission, showing the financial status and need, highlighting some of the activities of the Mission and giving a Face Book hot link through which you can maintain frequent up-dates regarding FMI, including photographs.

First, the FMI bank account is nearly bare. At the beginning of August only \$3,700 remain. Monthly bills are \$8,500. Between September and December (Honduran Federal law requires double salary pays in December and June) FMI will need approximately \$40,000 to pay the bills with no unusual emergency expenses or expansion of services.

Economic conditions. A disease swept through the coffee trees more than a year ago, creating financial havoc. Coffee production is the only source of income for the region, so residents went from extremely poor to desperate.

Evidence of **third-stage malnutrition** is appearing in clinic patients. Basic food grain prices have doubled in the most recent three years, creating a double-bind for area residents. People are unable to feed their families creating malnutrition that *compounds health issues*.

An incident. Recently, a 7 year-old girl with her father walked **5 hours** to reach the clinic, due to the girl's abdominal pain. The average weight for a 7 year-old is 52 pounds. The little girl weighed 37 lbs, She was suffering mostly from malnutrition. The clinic helped her with medication and education.

The **Mission's Agriculture Project** addresses the crisis in food availability in three ways (see accompanying descriptive notes).

The **clinic's three-part** task is to treat the ill and to teach prevention to the well. Especially useful is the effort to treat every woman of child-bearing age with folic acid to prevent of neural tube defects such as spina bifida. Medical screenings for hypertension, malnutrition, diabetes, cervical cancer with follow-up care for those showing evidence of any of these illnesses continues to be the focus of the clinic's work.

Your financial support helps keep people from hopelessness in the prevailing economic conditions.

How to Prepare to Host the Deli

Prior to your month, please check with the current Christian Ed director (Martha) to see if there will be Wednesdays in your month when there will be no Deli.

Your task as a group is to prepare and supervise the meals. Please divide up the work so that many people can be involved. You may invite people from outside your group to help.

The Deli typically serves 40-50 each night. The food usually covers the crowd, but some nights we run out. There are some nights we have excess food. Due to the nature of people's schedules, this happens. It's OK.

If you'd like to donate your purchases for the Deli – that's great. If you'd like to get credit for the donation on your Sunrise giving statement, please keep the receipts, circle purchases and give to Karmel. She cannot give you credit without a receipt.

If you'd like to be reimbursed, you may take the money from the donation basket or give the receipt to Karmel with your request.

We put a donation basket out. This may or may not cover your expenses. Donations are not mandatory. Over the years we have offered the Deli, we have come out ahead each year.

Serving starts at 5:15 and goes to 5:50. If you can only prepare the food, we plan to have people who will serve and clean-up for you. Please ask Betty Rasette for the helpers.
